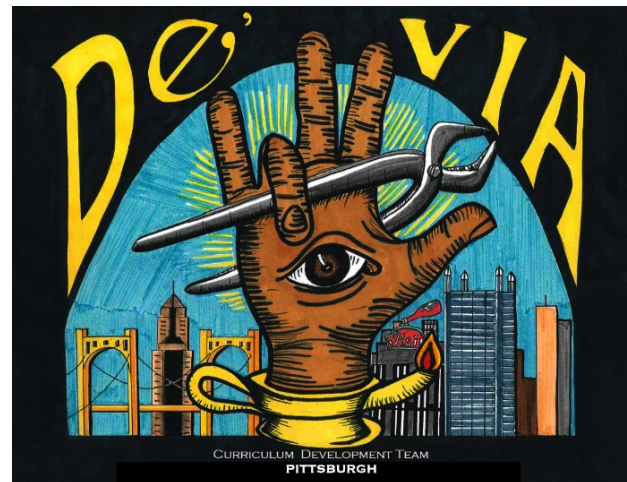

De'VIA (Deaf View/Image Art) is an art movement, which represents Deaf experiences. It was recognized as an genre of art in 1989. Since 2014, deaf art teachers from all over the United States have gathered annually to exchange ideas about De'VIA. Guided by the principles of the original De'VIA manifesto, the De'VIA Curriculum Development team aims to continue the creation of deaf art and build a strong curriculum that will teach concepts and technique as well as record the presence of Deaf Art in history. 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PRESENTERS

Ann Silver and Jim Van Manen



Ann Silver is co-founder of the Deaf Art Movement (DAM) of the 1960s that preceded the De'VIA genre. Silver has a BA in Commercial Art from Gallaudet and an MA from NYU. After working as a designer/art director for publishers in

Manhattan, Silver moved back home to Seattle and created her most iconic Deaf Pop Art work. A major Silver retrospective was held at NTID/RID in 2017.

Jim Van Manen is a Hard of Hearing coda. Jim has both an MA and a PhD from Gallaudet. He has been an artist since the early 1990s, and is also a linguist and Assistant Professor at Columbia College



Chicago. Jim is the author of *Ann Silver: Deaf Artist Series* (Empyrean Press) among others.

Silver and Jim established **Silver Moon Brand** in 2011. Their combined artistic forces extend the base of Silver's groundbreaking art on aspects of Deaf identity, Deaf culture, and ASL.

PRESENTERS

Nancy Rourke



Nancy Rourke (name sign, N3) is an internationally-known Deaf artist and activist. She is a full-time artist, and frequently does artist-in-residencies at Deaf schools and promotes De'VIA and Surdism. A

book about her work, *Nancy Rourke: Deaf Artist Series* (2014) is available from Empyrean Press. Originally from San Diego, California, she now makes her home in Loveland, Colorado.

Patti Durr



Born partially Deaf, Patti Durr grew up without sign language or any exposure to Deaf people prior to learning ASL at the age

of 20. She is an associate professor in RIT/NTID's Department of Cultural & Creative Studies. She has received RIT's Eisenhart Award for Outstanding Teaching, RIT's Vagina Warrior Award, NTID Student Congress Staff Humanitarian Awards and Outstanding Staff Awards. World War II and visual histories.
